Why has my doctor ordered this test?

The purpose of The Cunningham Panel™ is to assist your doctor to determine if the symptoms the patient experiences are the result of an infection-triggered autoimmune process, or the result of a traditional neurologic or psychiatric illness. This distinction is important, because treatment for the two conditions is completely different.

How are the results reported?

Results for four of the five Cunningham
Panel™ tests are reported as a titer (the
amount or concentration of a substance in
the blood). The fifth test, for CaM-Kinase II,
is reported as a percentage of activity over
a normal baseline. Results are recorded in
the patient report and compared to a
normal control range from non-affected
subjects.

How quickly are results available?

It takes approximately 2-3 weeks to process results due to the complexity of these tests. (See our website for current processing time). Please allow that amount of time to have your specimen processed and results returned to your physician or other healthcare provider.

Who files insurance and when is it filed?

EMPLOYER GROUP OR PRIVATE

PLANS: Moleculera will file a claim on your behalf. A deposit of \$495 is due with the specimen. Moleculera Labs is out-of-network with all insurance plans. Insurance discounts will not apply.

- Insurance is filed once the test report hasbeen released (which is usually 2-3 weeksafter the specimen is received).
- Moleculera does not participate with Medicare, TriCare, or any state Medicaid or Medicaid-funded plans. Therefore, we are unable to file claims for those plans. Patients must agree not to personally file a claim for reimbursement and must pay the full \$995 before or upon receipt of the specimen.

Steps you can take that may help get the panel covered by your insurance plan:

- Ask the ordering provider to give you the diagnosis codes they will use to justify the testing.
- Prior to specimen collection, use our INSURANCE CHECKLIST (available in the Parent & Patient Resources section of our website) to determine if the panel will be considered a covered benefit.
- Provide Moleculera's "Sole Provider" letter when you contact the insurance carrier (found on the website at moleculeralabs.com).
- Ask your insurance carrier for an out-of-network waiver (also called a "gap exception") since Moleculera is not contracted with any insurance networks or carriers.
- Ask your insurance carrier if the testing will be considered "innetwork" if the healthcare provider who orders the test is contracted with them.
- If your insurance plan requires a referral/authorization from your primary care provider (PCP) and the PCP did not order the test, ask the ordering provider to collaborate with your PCP to obtain the referral/authorization.
